

#### IF YOU CARE SHARE


Students in Year 10 took part in a Suicide Prevention and Mental Health workshop with local charity If You Care Share. Our visitors discussed their experiences of loss due to suicide and gave students coping strategies for challenging situations and dealing with a blip in their mental health.

- Why you picked this particular book
- Who would you recommend it to and why

Write a chapter for either a prequel or a sequel relating to your story.

Prequel: set before the story you have read.

Sequel: following on from the story you have read.

Challenge: use a range of simile/metaphor/personification to make your story descriptive
