Dear Parents/Carers

As you may have seen in the news, the National Education Union (NEU) has voted for strike action for teaching staff on 15 and 16 March 2023.

Teaching staff at our school have a legal right to take part in the planned strike action, however, it is important to emphasise that the dispute and strike action is not specific to our school. The industrial action is in relation to the NEU's dispute with the Government over the nationally agreed pay rises when taking into account the pressures faced by staff with the increased cost of living which we are all experiencing. It is a national issue, affecting all schools in England.

At this stage we do not know definitively how the planned strike action might impact our school. To assist with our planning, we have written to all teaching staff to ask them to confirm whether or not they intend to take part. There is no legal obligation on staff to respond, but we are hoping many will do so, so we have a better understanding of who intends to work on the planned strike days.

There is also a risk that teaching and support staff at our school might be impacted if their own children's school is closed. It is possible that some staff may need to take last minute time off to care for their own children, as a result of actions outside of our control.

Please be assured we have looked at this situation very carefully, to do everything reasonably possible to keep the school open for all, however due to the expected staff shortages, we have decided to keep the school open for **Year 10 and Year 11 ONLY with student in full and correct uniform.**

All other year groups (Y7, Y8, and Y9) will have a resource booklet available to them to complete at home, this will be available online or a paper copy will be available for them to collect on **Tuesday 14 March.**

Year 10 will focus on their core subjects for which they have some exams coming up.

Year 11 will focus on option subjects and will have reward afternoons on both days following their efforts during the mock exam period. Attendance on the day will count towards Prom Passport criteria and will also be used when references for Colleges or Apprenticeships are asked for.

Both year groups will be required to bring their school PE kit with them on both days.

Our Catering company, Chartwells, will be providing food throughout breaks and lunchtimes as usual for all students within school.

If your child is in Years 7, 8, or 9 and in receipt of free school meals and would like to come in at lunchtime (13:30 – 14:00) for a hot meal, they are more than welcome. They must wear full school uniform and enter and exit through the main reception only.

Please note there will be no GER or detentions on these dates.
