The purpose of <u>Operation Encompass</u> is to safeguard and support children and young people who have been involved in a domestic abuse incident. Durham County Council, Durham and Cleveland Police along with Northumbria Police and nominated Key Adults in school work together to make sure that school staff are made aware of an incident early enough to support pupils in school.




